

# **SACA INFRASTRUCTURE STRATEGY 2019-2029**

The South Australian Cricket Infrastructure Strategy is progressing with the recent completion of the first phase of community consultation.

The project team is now undertaking a detailed review of facility and participation data as well as developing the State of Play report and Draft Infrastructure Framework which will guide cricket infrastructure in South Australia over the next 10 years.

### WHO HAS BEEN CONSULTED?


The following consultation process was undertaken to identify the needs and priorities of stakeholders and to help inform the development of the South Australia Cricket Infrastructure Strategy:

### PARTICIPATION AND FACILITY DATA

Project consultants are currently working with SACA and Cricket Australia to finalise both the participation and facility data sets. Once finalised the analysis will be undertaken and form a crucial part of the State of Play report.

While this review of data sets has had a minor impact on project stage timelines, updated data will ensure a more evidence based strategy and a positive outcome for cricket facilities across South Australia. This has not impacted the delivery of the Final Strategy in June 2019.

### **NEXT STEPS AND FURTHER INFORMATION**

Following endorsement of identified need and strategic facility direction and the Draft Infrastructure Framework, the State of Play report will be finalised. This is expected to be complete by Mid February 2019, with the Draft Strategy to follow in April 2019. Key stakeholders will be notified when the Draft Strategy is available for comment. Feedback on the Draft Strategy will ensure all key cricket facility and infrastructure issues are covered in the Final Strategy.
