Role Purpose:	The Head Coach – SA Indigenous Men (Boomerangs) is responsible for the development of all players within the selected squad by delivering a player-centred training program and facilitating a positive game day environment.
Appointment Term:	1 September 2025 – 30 June 2026 (2026 National Indigenous Cricket Championships). There will be an option for a 12-month extension of this appointment term, by mutual written agreement following successful review.

Key Responsibilities

- Contribute to selection of the SA Indigenous Men (Boomerangs) squad in conjunction with the appointed Team Officials and relevant SACA staff.
- Plan and deliver an engaging training plan focused on player development.
- Record and analyse the training and performance of all players in the squad.
- Provide valuable and constructive feedback to the players and other relevant parties.
- Lead the squad at the National Indigenous Cricket Championships, including support in off-field travel and logistics.
- Implement appropriate team structures and strategies on game days.
- Develop and maintain a positive team environment.
- Contribute to the recruitment and retention of players in the squad.
- Contribute to a post-Championships review and/or report to measure success and identify opportunities for improvement based on agreed performance indicators.
- Contribute to the SACA Aboriginal Junior Cricket Academy.

- Experience coaching and/or working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
